Bedford Volunteer Potential Trails Projects for Businesses

The Town of Bedford, working with the Bedford Chamber of Commerce, has several trails projects that would be ideal as volunteer activities for businesses. All projects will be overseen by a member of the Bedford Trails Committee. Participants will need to sign a waiver. While some tools will be provided, volunteers should bring tools and/or wheelbarrows.

Project#1 202 South Road trail to the Minuteman bike path (across from and connecting to Hartwell Forest), led by Ralph Hammond. Volunteers would trim the trail (~100' long and 6-8' wide) and spread wood chips from the Minuteman Trail to the edge of the woods.

Project#2 Trail from 5 Doris Road to the main Blue Trail that connects to Fletcher Road, led by Michael Barbehenn. Volunteers would spread wood chips across the trail (~150 yards and 6-8' wide).

Project#3 Middle School/Minuteman Extension Trail Work, led by Clem Larson. Volunteers would enjoy a "Light Maintenance" Trail Walk, trimming while we walk through the nearby trails and sidewalk. Then volunteers would also clear weeds from the parking area and large sign.
